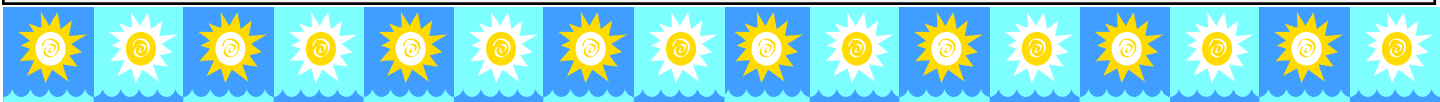

June is National Safety Month

The National Safety Council has designated June as "National Safety Month". This is a national annual campaign that continues all month. The overall theme this year is "Celebrating Safe Communities" because while both the national workplace injury and illness rate and the driving collision rate have decreased somewhat, the non-work accidental injury rate has increased dramatically.

According to the National Safety Council, "Nine out of 10 accidental fatalities and two-thirds of disabling injuries to workers occur off the job. In 2005, more than 60 percent of all accidental deaths involved either workers who were off the job or their family members.

The overall economic impact of all accidental injuries exceeds \$625 billion a year and is devastating to individuals, families and employers. The cost of on- and off-the-job accidental injuries is a staggering \$380 billion, of which 58%, or \$220 billion, are costs related to employee injuries off-the-job."

In the News: Facing Generic Rivals, Meds Get Price Hikes (Taken from AARP Bulletin May 2011 issue)

Prices have soared for some popular brand name drugs widely used by men and women—medications whose patents are close to expiring. Why? Manufacturers tend to hike the prices of these drugs in the year or so before they lose their exclusive marketing rights, according to two new reports. But the silver lining for consumers is that an unprecedented number of top brand-name prescription drugs are due to lose Patent protection in the next couple of years—opening the way for generic versions that cost far less. Blockbuster drugs scheduled to go off patent this year include Lipitor (used for high cholesterol) and Xalatan (glaucoma). In 2012 patents set to expire include those for Clarinex (allergies) and Avandia (diabetes). An analysis published in the AARP Rx Price Watch Report finds that cumulatively “the retail price of brand-name drugs that have faced generic competition in 2010 rose by 51%....between the end of 2004 and the end of 2009,” which equals an average hike of \$762.00 for one year of therapy between those two dates. Much of this increase took place in the two years before lower cost generic versions appeared on the market, the report adds. Supporting these findings is a new analysis of prices from the 15 best-selling drugs by Thomson Reuters Market Scan, which found much higher prices in 2010 than in earlier years. “ This analysis indicates drug makers are scrambling to make as much money as possible from blockbuster drugs before the patents expire,” Reuters reports.—Patricia Barry

New Report Sees Trucking Gains Through 2022

Arlington, Va. – After a dip during the Great Recession, the U.S. freight economy, particularly for trucking, is projected to grow significantly in the years ahead, according to American Trucking Association’s U.S. Freight Transportation Forecast to 2022.

The Forecast, the product of a collaboration between ATA, IHS Global Insight and Martin Labbe Associates, lays out the current state of the freight economy where trucking is the leading mode of transportation and projects an even more robust role for trucks in the future.

“The trucking industry continues to dominate the freight transportation industry in terms of both tonnage and revenue, comprising 67% of tonnage and 81% of revenue in 2010,” ATA Chief Economist Bob Costello wrote in this year’s forecast.

Overall, total freight tonnage is expected to grow by 24% by 2022, and revenue for the freight transportation industry is projected to rise 66% in that same timeframe. Trucking’s share of that market will rise to 70% by 2022, though the industry’s share of freight revenues will only increase to 81.4% from 81.2%.

In other surface modes, rail’s overall share of tonnage will fall to 14.6% in 2022 from 15.3% in the baseline year of 2010. However, intermodal tonnage will rise 6.6% a year between 2011 and 2016, and 5.5% annually through 2022. Revenues for intermodal transportation will jump from \$11.1 billion in 2010 to \$30.7 billion in 2022.

Domestic waterborne transportation will show very modest growth between now and 2022 – growing 2% a year until 2016, then 0.2% annually through 2022. Revenues for short-sea shippers will grow to \$16.2 billion in 2022 from \$11.1 billion in 2010.

“At a time when our nation’s leaders are debating what our future transportation system should look like, the Forecast is a tremendous resource,” Costello said. “The Forecast can also help America’s business leaders as they plan what their future logistics plans and businesses will look like.”

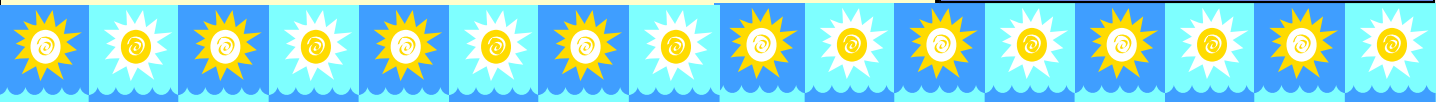
WELLNESS: Motivation checklist (taken from checklist4u.com)

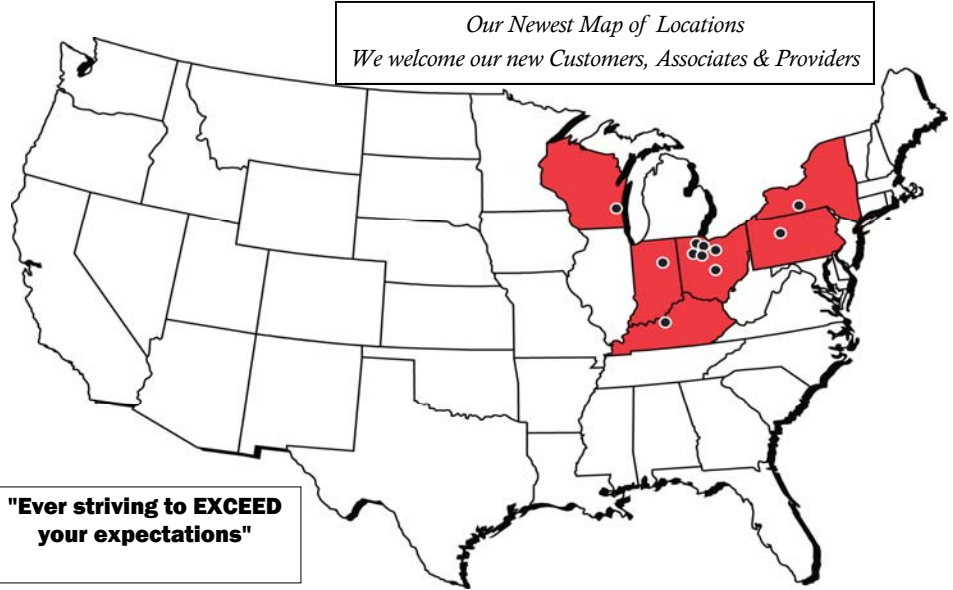
