Interesting Ohio History

During the 20th century, Akron was known as the "Rubber Capital of the World". In 1950, 4 of the 5 largest tire companies had their corporate offices in Akron including Goodrich Corp., Goodyear Tire and Rubber Company, Firestone Tire and Rubber Company, and General Tire. It is believed that during the 1950's, 1/3 of all rubber products were produced in Akron. By the late twentieth century, the rubber industry began to decline in Akron. Goodyear is the last major tire manufacturer still based in the city.

ISO Audit Successfully Completed at STL

Our Southern Tier Division recently underwent an ISO audit. The results were excellent with no nonconformances. Our Quality Assurance Manager, Scott Cramer, explains further:

ISO is an international standard organization for quality management systems. The standard that we are certified to is called ISO 9001:2015. The standard promotes the adoption of a process approach when developing, implementing and improving the effectiveness of a quality management system, to enhance customer satisfaction by meeting customer requirements. Two of our customers require us to be ISO certified to do business with them. Additionally, we are BRC certified which is an ISO type organization for the food industry. One of our customers has also made that a requirement. So, you can see that this is very important to our customers and STL because it strengthens our relationships and opens up further opportunities for business.

I mentioned a process based approach above.

The application of the process based approach in a quality management system enables:


- a. Understanding and consistency in meeting requirements.
- b. The consideration of processes in terms of added value.
- c. The achievement of effective process performance.
- d. Improvement of processes based on evaluation of data and information.

STL became certified in 2012 and has improved every year. If you took a snap shot of 2012 and put it up against the present you would see two totally different companies. This is a credit to the associates who have had to adapt to extreme change and the commitment of leadership to abiding by the standard. In my 30+ years in quality, most of which was with a fortune 500 company I have to say that I enjoy working with this group more than any other. I feel more attached to them because this system was built from the ground up and we've all grown up together.

Test Your Logistics IQ:

1) The total time required to manufacture an item, exclusive of lower-level purchasing lead time. For make-to-order products, it's the length of time between the release of an order to the production process and shipment to the final customer. For make-to-stock products, it's the length of time between the release of an order to the production process and receipt into finished goods inventory. Included are order preparation time, queue time, set-up time, run time, move time, inspection time, and put-away time.



2) In accounting, the assignment of costs that cannot be directly related to production activities via more measurable means, e.g., assigning corporate expenses to different products via direct labor costs or hours.



3) A three digit numerical representation that identifies a transaction set.
