Kyle Larson Wins!

35th Annual Ohio Logistics Brad Doty Classic

Kyle Larson became the first back-to-back winner of the 35th Annual Ohio Logistics Brad Doty Classic presented by Racing Optics on Tuesday, July 11 at Attica Raceway Park. Larson led all 40 laps to take home the \$15,000 top prize.

Attica Raceway Park has been very kind to the Elk Grove, California native as he has now won three Brad Doty Classics. He has six career wins at the track in just 10 A-main starts including five wins in the last six starts at Attica. It was Larson's 30th career win with the World of Outlaws NOS Energy Drink Sprint Car Series in just 133 feature starts.

While the final stats will show Larson led all 40 laps, Wooster, Ohio's Sheldon Haudenschild hounded Larson through lap 30. A restart with nine laps to go and a clear track saw Larson pull away for the victory in front of a standing room crowd.

"To think no one has won back-to-back in

this race is unbelievable. The balance of my race car felt really good thanks to Paul, Trevor, Doug, Kevin...everybody who helps out to get us to the track and get us on track. Thanks to all you fans for coming out. It's always a great event to come to Ohio...it's going to be an awesome week of racing. To start out with a win and hopefully build some momentum before we hit Eldora," said Larson.

The runner-up finish was a career best for Haudenschild in the Brad Doty Classic, and Cole Macedo survived a chaotic battle for the final podium position, matching his personal best finish in the Brad Doty Classic.

Brad Doty adds, "Having Mr. Chuck Bills' and his family's support of our race for 16 years means so much to all of us at Attica Raceway Park! The Ohio Logistics name and logo have become synonymous with the Brad Doty Classic, and it's been a great partnership. Thank you, Chuck, for all you do for not only our event but for other events and race teams!"

Interesting Ohio History

With the discovery of oil in Lima in 1885, Ohio began what came to be called the "Oil Boom of Northwest Ohio." Discovery actually began in Findlay, forty miles north of Lima. The discovery of natural gas deposits there in 1884 led to national marketing efforts advertising free gas, as Findlay's business leaders tried to "boom" the town. Standard Oil of Cleveland decided to build a refinery in Lima. Oil drilling fever hit Northwest Ohio and "boom towns" sprang up overnight. Fourteen independent Lima producers formed a combine - the Ohio Oil Company, now known as Marathon Petroleum Co., still located in Findlay today.

Artificial Intelligence (AI) is a cutting-edge field of computer science that aims to develop intelligent machines capable of performing tasks that typically require human intelligence. U.S. History Impress Your Friends



August 2, 1776, is one of the most important but least celebrated days in American history when 56 members of the Second Continental Congress started signing the Declaration of Independence in Philadelphia. Officially, the Congress declared its freedom from Great Britain on July 2, 1776, when it approved a resolution in a unanimous vote.

After voting on independence on July 2, the group needed to draft a document explaining the move to the public. It had been proposed in draft form by the Committee of Five (John Adams, Roger Sherman, Robert Livingston, Benjamin Franklin and Thomas Jefferson) and it took two days for the Congress to agree on the edits. Thomas Jefferson was the main author.

Once the Congress approved the actual Declaration of Independence document on July 4, it was sent to a printer named John Dunlap. About 200 copies of the Dunlap Broadside were printed, with John Hancock's name printed at the bottom. Today, 26 copies remain. Then on July 8, 1776, Colonel John Nixon of Philadelphia read a printed Declaration of Independence to the public for the first time on what is now called Independence Square.
