



Bryce Lucius Wins Brad Doty Classic



For years, young racers across northwest Ohio have packed the grandstands at Attica Raceway Park, dreaming that someday they might compete in the prestigious Brad Doty Classic. On a warm July evening in 2026, one of those dreams became reality when Findlay native Bryce Lucius delivered a performance that local race fans will never forget.

The Ohio Logistics Brad Doty Classic has long been one of sprint car racing's premier events, attracting the very best drivers in the country. Against a field of 49 competitors, including World of Outlaws champions and NASCAR superstar Kyle Larson, few expected the 19-year-old from Findlay to be the driver standing in Victory Lane when the dust settled.

Yet from the drop of the green flag, Lucius raced like a seasoned veteran. He confidently challenged the sport's biggest names, passed defending race winner Carson Macedo for the lead, and refused to be intimidated by the pressure of racing in front of a packed grandstand.

Late in the race, it appeared Larson was

poised to overtake Lucius for the win. Then fate intervened. With just eight laps remaining, Larson caught a rut entering Turns 3 and 4 and flipped, bringing out the caution flag. Suddenly, the young Findlay driver found himself leading one of the biggest sprint car races in America with only a handful of laps remaining.

Those final laps tested more than driving ability—they tested nerves. Thousands of fans rose to their feet as Lucius expertly navigated traffic while veteran Logan Schuchart closed in behind him. When the checkered flag finally waved, the cheers could likely be heard well beyond the Attica fairgrounds. A local kid had just defeated some of the greatest sprint car drivers in the world.

The victory was more than an upset. It marked Lucius's first World of Outlaws triumph in only his 19th series start, earned him the \$20,000 winner's prize, and forever placed his name alongside the legends who have won the Brad Doty Classic.

For the people of Findlay, however, the significance reached beyond statistics. Bryce

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Interesting Ohio History

On August 14, 1933, at 11:55 a.m., John Dillinger and his gang robbed the Bluffton, OH Citizen National Bank. Four armed, unmasked men entered the bank, where three employees and one customer were present. The robbery lasted less than five minutes before a bank alarm and the town whistle forced the gang to flee. Witnesses estimated that 20 to 30 shots were fired, mostly into the air to discourage onlookers. Although the robbers stole \$2,100, a time-locked safe prevented further losses. Dillinger was later captured, but escaped from Lima's jail on October 12, 1933, during a breakout that killed Sheriff Jesse Sarber.

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Lucius wasn't simply another race winner—he was a hometown young man who proved that talent, determination, and years of hard work can carry someone from local dirt tracks to one of sprint car racing's grandest stages.

Long after the engines fell silent, fans lingered around Victory Lane, soaking in the moment. For one unforgettable summer night, all of northwest Ohio celebrated together, proud that one of its own had written a remarkable new chapter in Ohio racing history.

Core competencies are embodied in the skills of the workers and in the organization. They are developed through collective learning, communication, and commitment to work across levels and functions in the organization and with the customers and suppliers.



2) a) The unrecovered balance of an investment. It's a cost already paid that is not relevant to the decision concerning the future that is being made. Capital already invested that for some reason cannot be retrieved.
b) A past cost that has no relevance with respect to future receipts and disbursements of a facility undergoing an economic study. This concept implies that since a past outlay is the same regardless of the alternative selected, it should not influence the choice between alternatives.

Keep Your Devices Cool This Summer

Extreme heat can be tough on more than just people—it can also damage laptops, tablets, smartphones, and other electronic devices. Leaving technology in a hot car, direct sunlight, or poorly ventilated areas can cause batteries to wear out faster, reduce performance, and even lead to permanent damage. A little extra care during hot weather can help keep your devices working properly and avoid unexpected disruptions.

To protect your technology, avoid leaving devices in parked vehicles and keep them

out of direct sunlight whenever possible. If you're working remotely or traveling, store devices in a shaded, cool location and make sure air vents are not blocked. If a device feels unusually hot, give it time to cool down before continuing to use or charge it.

Remember: if the temperature is uncomfortable for you, it's probably not ideal for your technology either. Taking a few simple precautions during periods of extreme heat can help extend the life of your devices, protect important information, and keep you productive all summer long.

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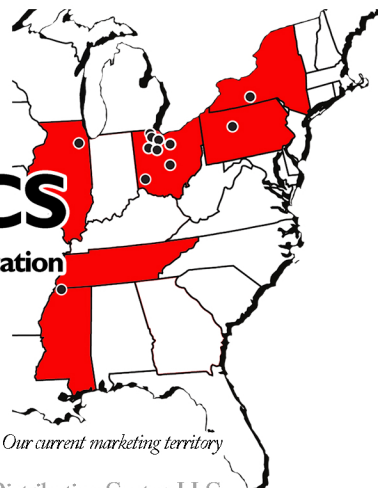
