#### Interesting Ohio History

William Tecumseh Sherman of Lancaster, OH was a prominent Union general during the American Civil War, known for his strategic brilliance and unconventional approach to warfare. Born in 1820, he gained fame for his "March to the Sea," a campaign that aimed to break the Confederacy's ability to wage war by targeting infrastructure and supply lines. Sherman emphasized total war—not against civilians, but against the South's capacity to sustain its armies. His tactics were highly effective and contributed significantly to the Union's victory. After the war, he served as Commanding General of the U.S. Army, shaping military policy for years to come.

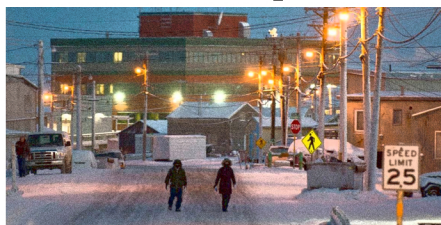

## Be Safe

### Winter Driving Tips

When winter weather strikes, drivers face out-of-the-ordinary challenges when they get behind the wheel. Snow, slush or icy roads are involved in nearly one in four weather-related vehicle crashes. If you must travel during winter weather, be sure to prepare your car in advance to help you drive more safely. Follow these winter driving safety tips to help you prepare for the elements before you face them on the road.

- As temperatures start to drop, include an ice scraper, snow shovel and sand or road salt in your vehicle.
- Keep your windshield wipers in good condition and your windshield fluid topped off. Make it a practice to keep your gas tank full so you can run your engine and stay warm if you get stuck or stranded. Keeping your gas tank full in extended cold weather can also help minimize the amount of water vapor in your tank, which can freeze when temperatures drop.
- If you plan to travel when inclement weather looms, monitor road and weather conditions by checking local news stations or internet traffic and weather sites.
- Before you leave the driveway or parking lot, take time to clear snow and ice off your car. Drive with your headlights on and be sure to keep them clean to improve visibility. As you get on the road, remember that speed limits are meant for dry roads, not roads covered in snow and ice. Increase your following distance as road conditions and visibility worsen. Be cautious on bridges and overpasses as they are commonly the first areas to become icy.

## Be Safe Out There

A recent safety incident at a warehousing and transportation facility occurred when a forklift operator struck a partially loaded pallet, causing it to topple and injure an employee staging freight nearby. The investigation determined that the operator's visibility was reduced due to an elevated load and that the pedestrian employee was positioned within an active equipment travel lane. Although injuries were moderate, the event highlighted gaps in traffic control and communication.

Several measures could have prevented the incident. Forklift operators should travel

with loads lowered whenever possible to maintain clear visibility. Pedestrian walkways and equipment-only zones must be clearly marked and consistently enforced. Pre-shift safety briefings should emphasize situational awareness during high-volume periods. When visibility is limited, spotters should be assigned, and all employees should receive refresher training on traffic patterns and right-of-way rules.

Implementing these controls would reduce the likelihood of similar incidents and support a safer, more efficient workplace.

### Test Your Logistics IQ:

1) A form of cooperative relationship among companies in Japan where the companies largely remain legally and economically independent, even though they work closely in various ways, such as sole sourcing and financial backing. A member of a keiretsu generally owns a limited amount of stock in other member companies. A keiretsu generally forms around a bank and a trading company but distribution (supply chain) keiretsus exist, linking companies from raw material suppliers to retailers.



2) A number usually produced to recognize and give authority for a faulty (perhaps) good to be returned to a distribution center or manufacturer. A form generally required with a warranty/return which helps the company identify the original product and the reason for the return. The RMA number often acts as an order form for the work required in repair situations, or as a reference for credit approval.



3) The party that tenders goods for transportation.

Isaac: If I could trade places with anyone in life, it would be with a person less fortunate than me. I'd do this so I could reflect and think about how blessed I really am.



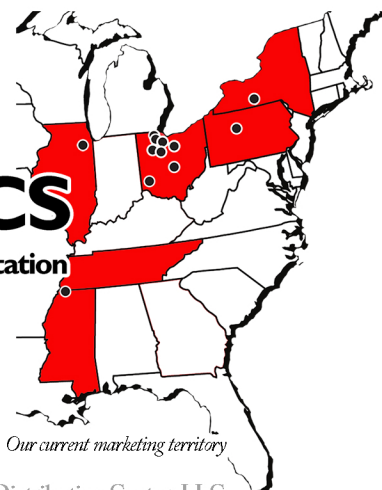
