Ohio Logistics' Southern Tier Activates Foreign Trade Zone in STL Business Park

Findlay's Tall Timbers Distribution Center dba Southern Tier Logistics is pleased to announce the activation of it's newest Foreign Trade Zone-FTZ #37G located in the Southern Tier Business Park in Horseheads, NY. The new FTZ offers 461,000 square feet of warehouse space in the newly designed business park. Findlay's Tall Timbers has been involved in FTZ operations since 1988 with Ohio Logistics acting as the general purpose warehouse operator for zone #151 in Findlay Ohio.

Understanding Foreign Trade Zones in Warehousing and Manufacturing

A Foreign Trade Zone (FTZ) is a designated area within the United States, considered outside U.S. Customs territory for tariff and tax purposes. Established to promote international trade and economic growth, FTZs offer significant advantages to businesses involved in warehousing and manufacturing.

Concept and Structure of FTZs

An FTZ can be likened to a secure, dutyfree area where foreign and domestic goods can be stored, assembled, and even manufactured without being subject to customs duties and certain taxes until they leave the zone and enter U.S. commerce. This setup is designed to enhance the global competitiveness of U.S. companies by reducing operational costs and encouraging investment.

Benefits of FTZ

The benefits of operating within an FTZ are multifaceted. Primarily, businesses can defer customs duties on goods until they are shipped from an FTZ location into the U.S. market. This deferral can significantly improve cash flow and reduce upfront costs. Additionally, if the goods are re-exported from the FTZ, no duties are paid at all, offering substantial savings.

Direct delivery expedites movement of cargo from port of arrival to the FTZ and weekly entries for consumption allow withdrawal of merchandise from FTZ for US consumption based on a weekly estimated cargo release. This potentially reduces the merchandise processing fee (MPF) from .3464% of merchandise value to a per entry cap of

Interesting Ohio History

Even though Delaware, OH was still a small community, in 1812, when the capital of Ohio was moved from Chillicothe, Delaware and Columbus were both in the running and Delaware lost by a single vote to Columbus. However, following the War of 1812, settlers began arriving in Delaware in greater numbers. Among some of the earliest settlers were the parents of Rutherford B. Hayes, the 19th President of the United States. The Hayes home no longer stands, but a historical marker in front of a BP station marks the location.

\$614.35 and potentially reduces customs brokerage fees due to filing fewer entries per week.

For manufacturers, FTZs offer even greater opportunities for cost savings and operational efficiencies. When raw materials or components are imported into an FTZ, no duties are paid upon entry. If these materials are then used to manufacture finished products within the zone, companies can choose to pay duties on either the original materials or the finished product, whichever rate is lower. This flexibility can lead to significant reductions in overall duty costs. This reduction in duty is referred to as inverted tariff.

Moreover, manufacturers can benefit from duty exemption on scrap and waste materials generated during production. In a traditional customs environment, duties would still apply to these materials, increasing costs unnecessarily. FTZs alleviate this burden, providing a more cost-effective manufacturing process.

Economic and Competitive Impact

The economic impact of FTZs extends beyond individual businesses to the broader economy. By reducing costs and increasing efficiency, FTZs help attract foreign investment and stimulate job creation. Companies operating in FTZs are often more competitive on the global stage, as they can offer products at lower prices due to reduced operational expenses.

Additionally, FTZs contribute to regional economic development. The presence of an FTZ can lead to the creation of ancillary businesses and services, such as logistics providers, transportation companies, and professional services, further boosting local economies.

Regulatory Framework and Compliance

Operating within an FTZ requires adherence to specific regulatory requirements set by the U.S. Foreign-Trade Zones Board and Customs and Border Protection (CBP). Traffic City Ohio Logistics Provides Space




Over 530 Putnam County kindergartners attended a special program last month. The students visited Safety City to learn about railroad, pedestrian, seatbelt, and bike safety.

Putnam County Sheriff's Office, Ottawa Police Departments, and other volunteers made the city come alive for the kids.

D-Day 80th Anniversary



D-Day was the name given to the June 6, 1944, invasion of the beaches at Normandy in northern France by troops from the United States, Canada, the United Kingdom and other countries during World War II. France at the time was occupied by the armies of Nazi Germany, and the amphibious assault—codenamed Operation Overlord—landed some 156,000 Allied soldiers on the beaches of Normandy by the end of the day.

Despite their success, some 4,000 Allied troops were killed by German soldiers defending the beaches. At the time, the D-Day invasion was the largest naval, air and land operation in history, and within a few days about 326,000 troops, more than 50,000 vehicles and some 100,000 tons of equipment had landed. By August 1944, all of northern France had been liberated, and in spring of 1945 the Allies had defeated the Germans. Historians often refer to D-Day as the beginning of the end of World War II.

Welcome to "Tech Talk," your inside source for all things IT. Securing your home network is essential to protect your personal data and devices from cyber threats. Start by updating your router's firmware regularly to patch any security vulnerabilities. Use a strong, unique password for your Wi-Fi network and avoid common words or easily guessable information. Opt for the latest encryption standard, WPA3, if available. Disable Wi-Fi Protected Setup (WPS), as it can be exploited by attackers. Rename your network's SSID (Service Set Identifier) to something non-identifiable, removing any default names that might hint at the router model, which could be targeted by

hackers. Additionally, ensure all connected devices have up-to-date security software, including antivirus programs and firewalls. Regularly check for and install updates on your devices to close any security loopholes.

Did you know? Wireless internet existed for 10 years prior to the first iPhone release.

Fact: The first text message, also known as an SMS (Short Message Service), was sent on December 3, 1992. Oddly enough, the first text message was not sent from a mobile phone but from a computer. At the time, mobile phones did not yet have the capability to send text messages.

Test Your Logistics IQ:

1) A schedule of end items to finish the product for specific customers orders in a make-to-order or assembleto-order environment. It's also referred to as the finishing schedule because it may involve operations other than just the final assembly; also, it may not involve assembly, but simply final mixing, cutting, packaging, etc. The FAS is prepared after receipt of a customer order as constrained by the availability of material and capacity, and it schedules the operations required to complete the product from the level where it is stocked (or master scheduled) to the end-item level.



2) The process of identifying, prioritizing, and aggregating, as a whole with constituent parts, all sources of supply that are required and add value in the supply chain of a product or service at the appropriate level, horizon, and interval.



3) The breakdown of the work in an activity into smaller elements.

Judy: I live in Fostoria, so I would recommend Dells and their BBQ ribs although their grilled mac and cheese with pulled pork is pretty


OL: Biggest goal in the next five years? Judy: To get healthier.
