Hybrid car owners are the most satisfied over the longer term. In a study of 2012-2013 model year cars with the most satisfied owners, hybrids take the top five spots, and the top three of those are all Toyotas...Highlander Hybrid, Avalon Hybrid, and Camry Hybrid. The car with highest percentage of original owners after eight years is the Highlander Hybrid at 38%. The Avalon Hybrid is still owned by 36.5% of original owners, and the Camry Hybrid by 34.6%. All those percentages are more than two times the average of original owner retention of eight-year-old cars. However, Toyota scored fourth as a brand for owner satisfaction after eight years. Volkswagen was in first place, followed by Subaru and Honda.

Use apps to replace your cable boxes. Instead of paying \$10 per month or more per television, you may be able to use a fee app to bring in your favorite channels. Comcast has apps for Roku media players and many Samsung and LG connected TVs. AT&T has different apps for its different services, including an Amazon Fire app with U-verse and support for Google and Apple share to TV features with AT&TTV service. Spectrum has apps for Android, iOS and some Amazon Kindle Fire tab-lets. Dish Network has an app for Android, iOS, and Amazon Kindle Fire tablets and TV players. Verizon has a Fios TV app supporting Chromecast and AirPlay. It's best to contact your cable provider to find out what apps are available.

2) The total cost to process repairs, refurbished, excess, obsolete, and end-of-life products, including diagnosing problems and replacing products. Includes the costs of logistics support, materials, centralized functions, troubleshooting service requests, on-site diagnosis and repair, external repair, and miscellaneous. These costs are broken into Returns Order Management, Returns Inventory Carrying, Returns Material Acquisition, Finance, Planning, IT, Disposal, and Warranty Costs.

OL: Favorite local restaurant, and what do you order?


Paul: The Beer Barrel, and I like the pulled pork taco.
