Veterans Day

Honoring Ohio's Heroes of World War II

On November 11th, across Ohio, families and communities come together to honor Veterans Day—a day that remembers the brave men and women who have served in the U.S. Armed Forces. Among Ohio's proudest moments is its deep connection to World War II, a time when thousands of its citizens answered the call to serve both at home and abroad.

During WWII, nearly 839,000 Ohioans enlisted or were drafted into military service. These individuals fought on battlefields across Europe and the Pacific, often under grueling conditions. Ohio became a vital hub for not just soldiers, but also for the manufacturing of military equipment. Cleveland's factories produced tanks, Akron's rubber companies supplied tires and military boots, and Dayton engineered precision instruments essential to aircraft. It was a state-wide effort that united everyone toward the common goal of victory.

One remarkable story is that of Major Thomas Griffin from Greenfield, Ohio.

Griffin was one of the brave Doolittle Raiders who carried out the daring bombing raid on Tokyo in April 1942. Against all odds, Griffin's crew navigated dangerous skies in B-25 bombers, becoming national heroes and a symbol of hope for a country struggling through the early days of the war.

Ohio's contributions didn't stop on the front lines. Women in the state also stepped up, working tirelessly in factories and hospitals while supporting war efforts through volunteerism. Rosie the Riveter—a national icon—was embodied by countless women across Ohio, symbolizing resilience and sacrifice.

Veterans Day is a powerful reminder of their dedication. Whether marching in parades, visiting memorials, or hearing veterans share their stories, Ohioans reflect on the legacy left by those who served in WWII. Interesting Ohio History

Harvey Firestone of Columbiana, OH was an American businessman, and the founder of the Firestone Tire and Rubber Company, one of the first global makers of automobile tires. After graduating from Columbiana High School, Firestone worked for the Columbus Buggy Company in Columbus, Ohio before starting his own company in 1890, making rubber tires for carriages. In 1900 he soon sow the huge potential for marketing tires for automobiles and then founded the Firestone Tire and Rubber Company, a pioneer in the mass production of tires. Firestone, Henry Ford, and Thomas Edison were generally considered the three leaders in American industry at the time.

Test Your Logistics IQ:

1) Global Tracking Identification Number or Global Trade Item Number. GTIN is the globally-unique EAN.UCC System identification number, or key, used for trade items (products and services). It's used for uniquely identifying trade items (products and services) sold, delivered, warehoused, and billed throughout the retail and commercial distribution channels. Unlike a UPC number, which only provides information specific to a group of products, the GTIN gives each product its own specific identifying number, giving greater accuracy in tracking.



2) Total cost of a computer asset throughout its life cycle, from acquisition to disposal. TCO is the combined hard and soft costs of owning networked information assets. "Hard" costs include items such as the purchase price of the asset, implementation fees, upgrades, maintenance, contracts, support contracts, disposal costs, and license fees that may or may not be up-front or charged annually. These costs are considered "hard costs" because they are tangible and easily accounted for.
